### Do you know somebody who deserves an honour?

- Anyone can nominate somebody for an honour
  - o E.g. colleague, friend, family, person who has been helped by them
  - The person being nominated can be of any age
    - Honours have been given to everyone from teenagers to people in their 90s
- The form to nominate is straight forward
  - You can even do it online www.gmhonours.org/nominate
    - There are guidelines and a video to help
  - The best nominations describe the difference this person makes
    - What really makes them stand out from others?
  - You need 2 letters of support
- Once a nomination form is received, extensive checks must take place
  - Please be patient it can take 12 to 24 months for these to be completed
- Please do remember that you can't tell the person that they are being nominated
  - O This is very important!
