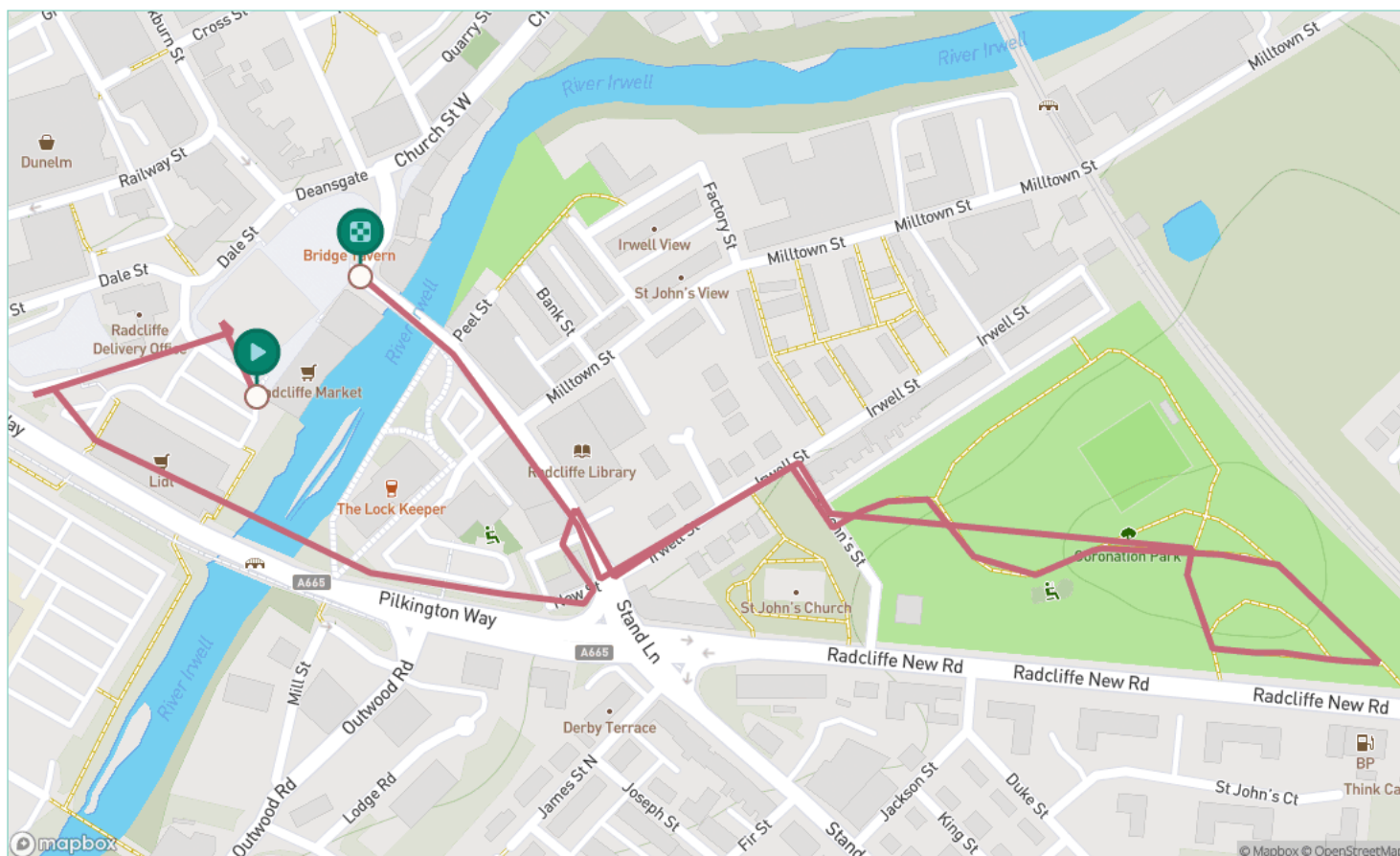

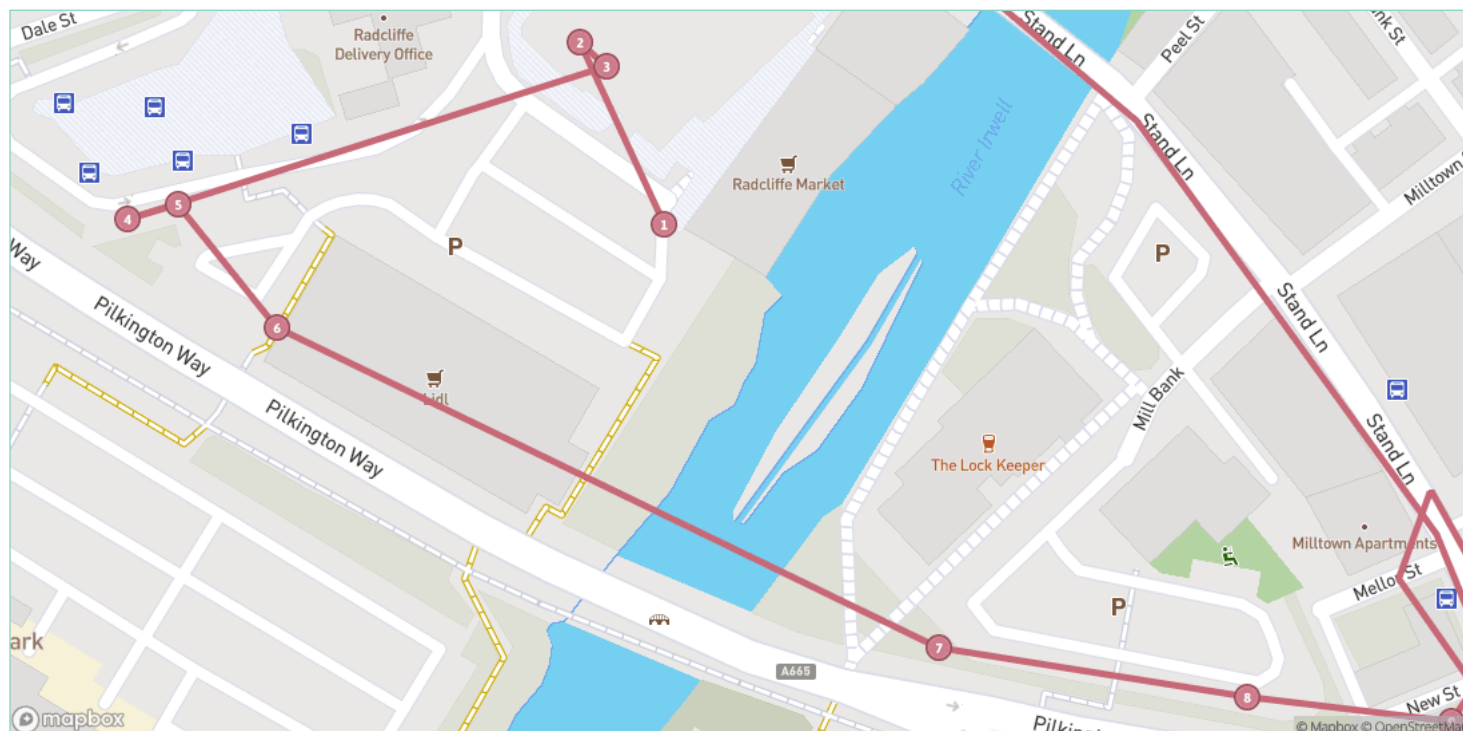

Step 1: Start at Radcliffe Market which has an accessible toilet, food and drink. Lidl car park has accessible bays and parking for 1.5 hours.

Step 2: Continue from the entrance of the market up passed the the new hub site & turn left over to Lidl

Step 3: Continue along the path In Between Lidl & the bus station

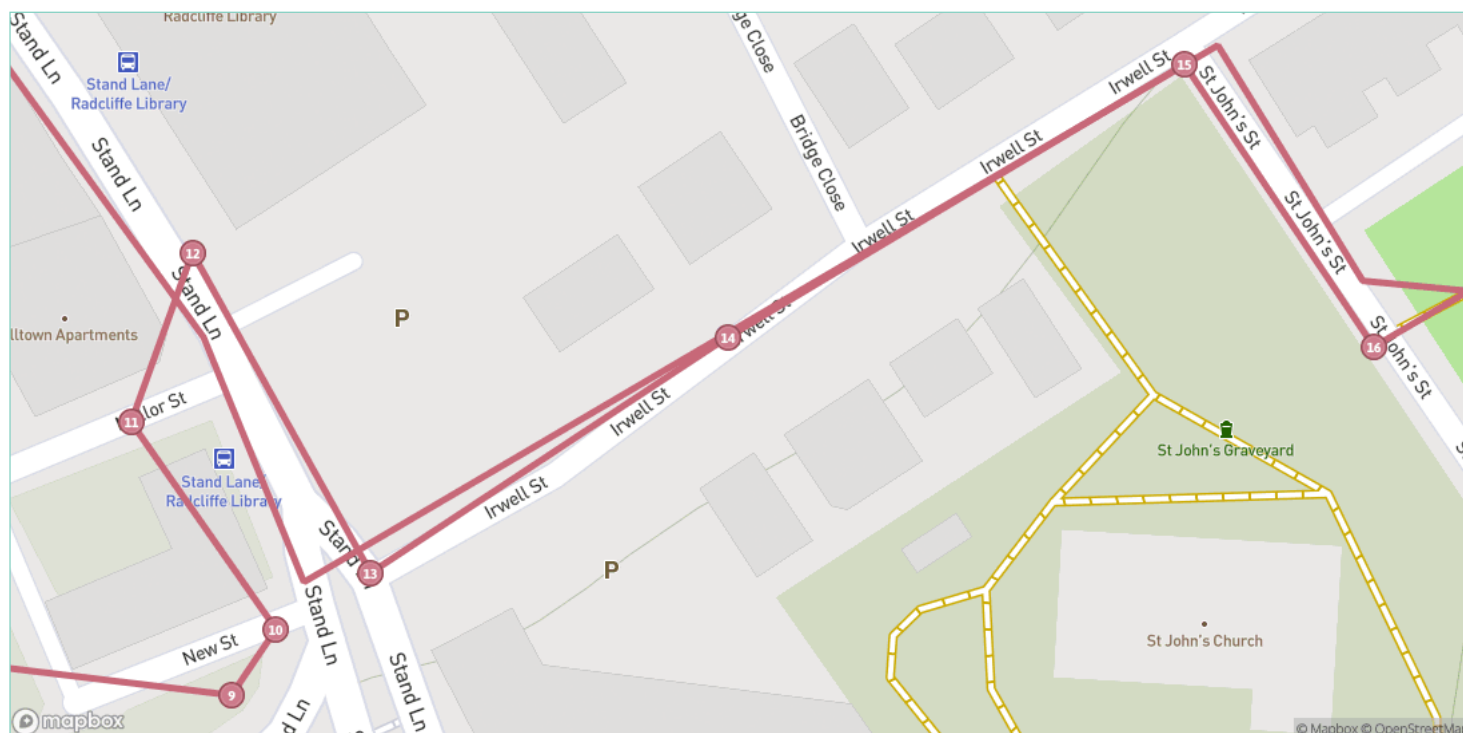
Step 4: Turn left at the end of the path on to Pilkington way

Step 5: Continue passed the sign & crossing point

Step 6: Continue under the sign

Step 7: Continue along Pilkington way

Step 8: Continue passed the sign bearing to the left



Step 9: Continue following the path round to the left

Step 10: Continue towards the crossing point

Step 11: Turn right at the crossing point, cross over the road & turn right

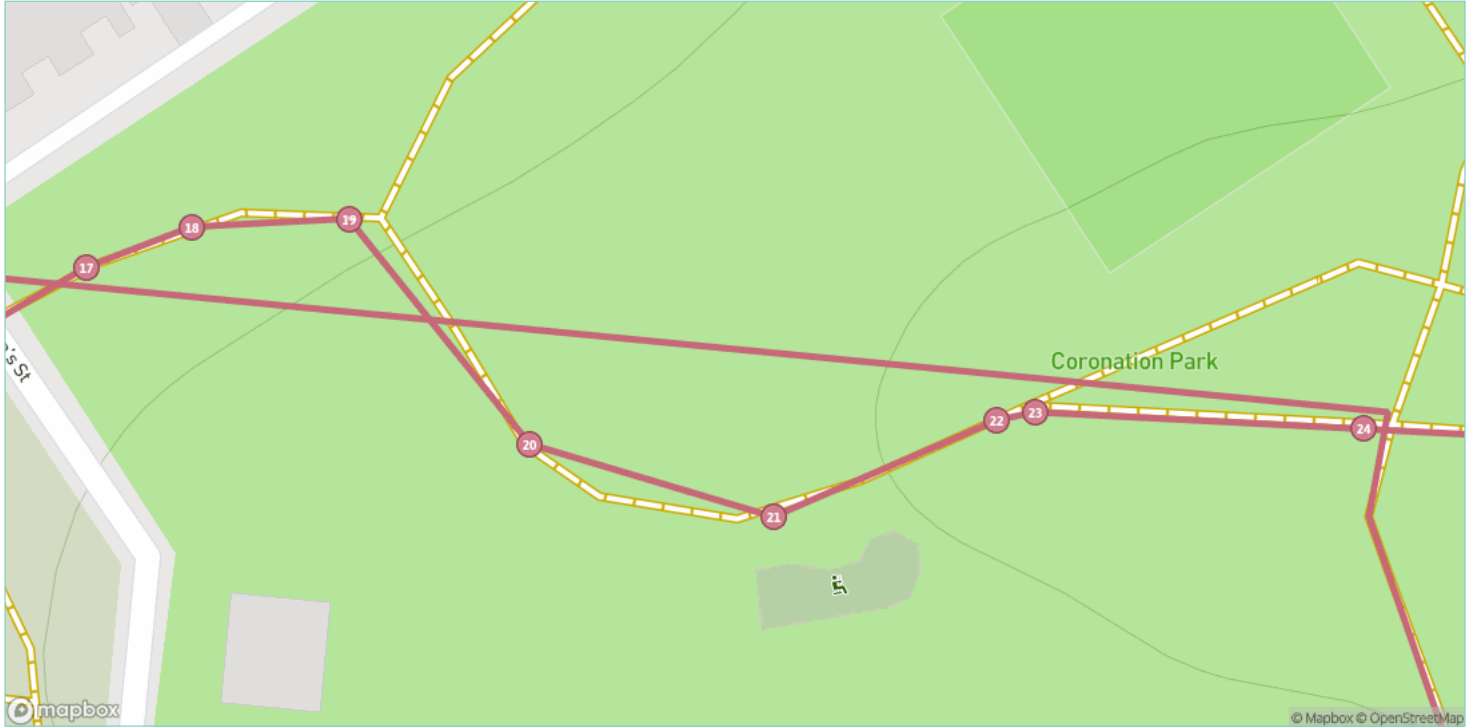
Step 12: Cross at the tactile paving to Radcliffe Library and carry on right.

Step 13: Go left onto Irwell Street

Step 14: Continue on down the street. There may be bushes overhanging to the left and pavement parked cars.

Step 15: Cross at the drop curb and head up the fairly steep hill on St Johns Street to Coronation Park.

Step 16: Mind the bollard on the way in. The surface is bit grainy but relatively smooth.



Step 17: There's a slight incline as you head up the hill.

Step 18: As the hill becomes more steep, there's a fork in the path to take you left or straight on. For this walk, we're going straight on.

Step 19: Continue up the hill and follow it round to the left

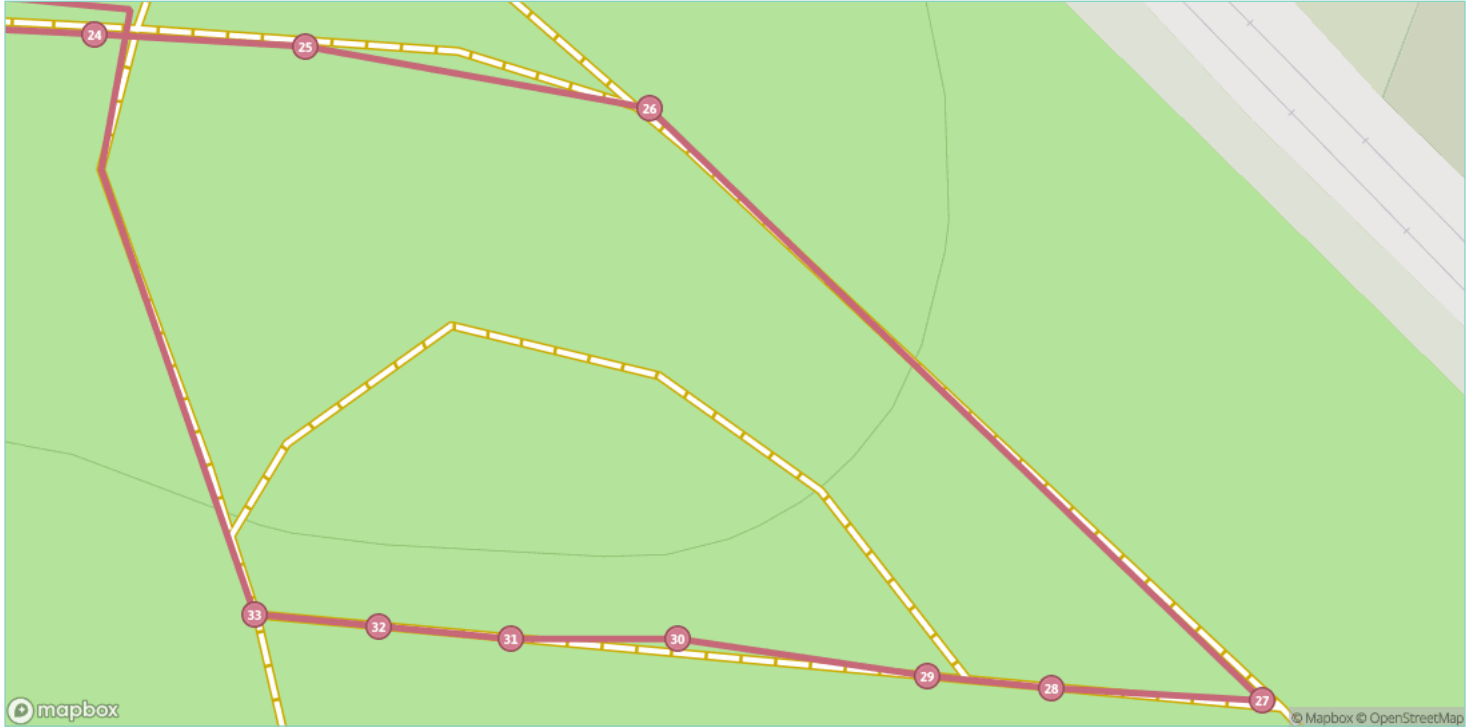
Step 20: The path becomes more flat as you reach the children's park; which can get busy 8am - 8:30am and after 3pm.

Step 21: To your left is a lovely, hilly view of Bury / Rochdale (we think)

Step 22: Another fork but for this walk we'll be carrying on straight. There are benches here if you need a rest.

Step 23: From the bench, you might be lucky enough to see a game of croquet.

Step 24: Continue on down the path.



Step 25: There may be a bit of tree debris as you continue.

Step 32: Some bushes are overgrown and intrude on the path.

Step 26: Head down a relatively steep decline. Be aware of the overhanging branches.

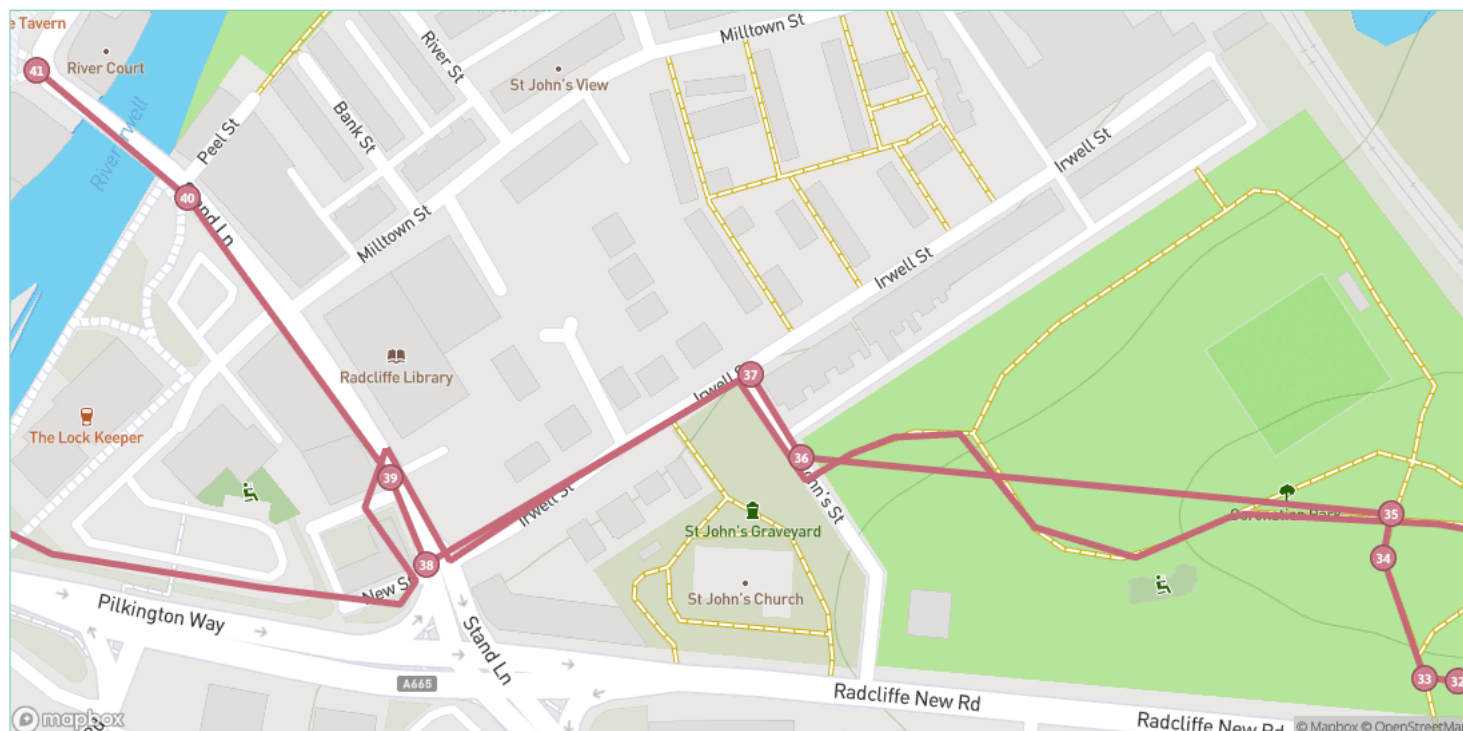
Step 27: Before the bottom of the hill, do an about turn and go right. There is a garage across the road if your peckish.

Step 28: Continue down a less steep path but, again, mind the overhanging branches.

Step 29: Stay central on the path to avoid the tree debris.

Step 30: Pass the information notice board and continue straight on.

Step 31: There are two bollards coming up. They should be wide enough for most to get through.



Step 33: Go right at the bend to carry on down the path.

Step 41: You're back to Radcliffe Market.

Step 34: Make your way through the bollard and continue down the steep hill.

Step 35: Continue down the path to get back to the entrance.

Step 36: Head back onto St John's Street and back to Radcliffe Market.

Step 37: Head down Irwell Street to the main road.

Step 38: Go back the way you came down the road to get back to Radcliffe Market.

Step 39: Cross at the tactile paving

Step 40: Continue on. There may be some a-boards and signs either side of the pavement.
