

Information for schools



During this half term we have launched the SENCO Solution Meeting at Elms Bank College Hub. The meeting ran over a morning and an afternoon session and worked to give all SENCOs within the authority local and national updates as well as key information in order to support access to key services within the authority. Feedback evidenced that SENCOs that attended were appreciative of the updates and felt 'supported and listened to with the SENCO Network responding to feedback'. The meeting welcomed updates from the Educational Psychology Service that presented work on the Graduated Approach in Bury LA, as well as key information from the Virtual School who also serve to offer a range of training packages to inform practice around trauma and attachment. The afternoon session brought together the workings of the Inclusion Team, the EHC team, school nursing and representation from CAMHS.
