

Trinity Baptist Walk

A wheel friendly wander through 3 local green spaces. Plenty of benches en route and a kids playground too.

Distance 1.6 kilometers / 1 miles

Duration 45 minutes



















Step 1: The walk starts at Trinity Baptist Chruch who may be kind enough to let you use their parking bays. If not, there are some along the road.

Step 2: The nearest bus stop is just off Westminster Ave opposite the church - Kilburn Road.

Step 3: Cross the Westminster Avenue to get to the dropped kerb on the other side

Step 4: Cross Kilburn Rd to get onto the other side of the road via the dropped kerb. There are bollards along this road and the pavement is uneven


Step 5: Once at the bus stop, bear left and head down the street to enter Milton Road field.

Step 6: Continue ahead on the tarmac park. There are overhanging branches, brambles and nettles along a narrow path. the bushes are cut back yearly

Step 7: Reach the end of the path and veer left to cross Milton Road via the dropped kerb. Be careful of the traffic.

Step 8: Cross the triangle junction to the right via the dropped kerb and continue left down the path.





Step 9: Continue down Wordsworth Road. The pavement is slightly uneven in places

Step 16: Continue ahead past outside tennis courts and gym on the right.

Step 10: Use the dropped kerb to cross Keats Crescent & continue down Wordsworth Road. No tactile paving but a slightly decline for the dropped kerb.

Step 11: Further along there were cars parked on the pavement along the road.


Step 12: Shortly after passing Keats Crescent, cross Wordsworth at dropped kerb part way up the road. Turn right on the other side.

Step 13: Turn left to enter Bolton Road Park through the manual swing gate.

Step 14: Continue down the lovely smooth tarmac path shaded either side by trees. The crown green bowling is just off to the right.

Step 15: There are benches along the path throughout the park for a well deserved rest.





Step 17: Do a left at the children's playpark – which may become busy either side of school times and during school holidays.

Step 18: Follow the path round to the right then follow it as it bends to the left.

Step 19: Continue along the concrete path.

Step 20: Head through the next metal swing fence.


Step 21: Mind the bollard in the middle of the path as you come through the gate

Step 22: Continue as the path bears slight left down the path with houses either side.

Step 23: Coming out of the path and into the clearing. Go right on Coronation Road.

Step 24: Continue down Coronation Road on the paved path.





Step 25: At the dropped kerb, turn left to cross the road.

Step 26: Turn left onto Colshaw Close South and enter the pavement at the next dropped kerb to the left which does have a slight incline.

Step 27: Continue up to the grass. The pavement is slightly uneven.

Step 28: Continue slight left up the path. It is quite narrow with weeds either side.


Step 29: Follow the narrow tarmac path to the right. There are some overhanging branches and brambles to consider.

Step 30: Follow the path round to the left and take in the geese in the pond on the right. There are some overhanging branches along the path.

Step 31: There's a slight incline as you head up to the next section of the path. Continue ahead.

Step 32: Head towards the exit with fences either side at the end of the path to get back onto Coronation Road.





Step 33: Cross Coronation Road by the dropped kerb by Community Centre and head up Westminster Avenue on the opposite side.

Step 34: Continue straight after the slight uneven and bump dropped kerbs.

Step 35: You're back at Trinity Baptist Church. Well done! We hope you enjoyed this step-free jaunt.
