Volunteer Training

Do you volunteer for a charity, community group or faith institution?

If so, you may benefit from WRAP training.

WRAP stands for Workshop to Raise Awareness of Prevent and helps individuals throughout the community to notice the signs of radicalisation and in knowing what to do when they notice these signs. The workshop in question is an hour and 20 minutes in length and contains the following learning objectives.

- * To understand Prevents aims
- * To think about who may be vulnerable to terrorism
- * To see how others are able to influence and manipulate people to commit crimes
- * To recognise when a vulnerable individual may be in need of your help
- * To know what help and support is available and to know who you should turn to when supporting someone

Although this training is of particular use to volunteers who work with vulnerable individuals, it is worth noting that radicalisers will target anyone if they believe it will lead to their desired outcome. Considering this, WRAP training is suitable for all volunteers who wish to prevent radicalisation within their own place of work and wider community.
